Equal representation and participation of men and women in community level decision-making and control.

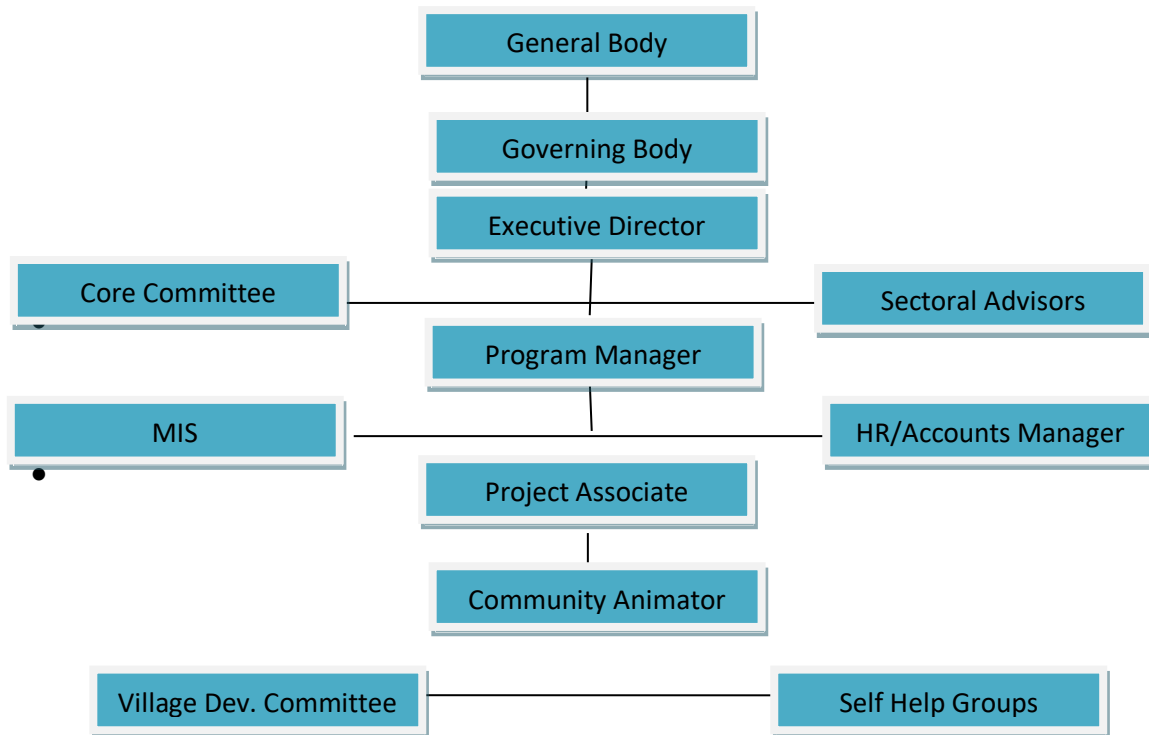

Background of Project: Marriage No Child's Play:-

The Project ANANYA Marriage No Child's Play geography consist of 43 villages of 09 cluster/GPs where 4278 adolescent enabling the environment of SRHR and free of child marriage through various adolescent group interaction, trainings, meetings at different level. To empower the voice of adolescent to access the needs and rights of health services, child protection system, livelihood opportunity and mainstreaming formal education system.

Goal of Project: "Life and well being of young people that enhances and improve the SRHR issues".

Objective: Young People are able to decide if and when to marry and pursue their SRHR in a supportive environment.

Major Achievements (Key Result of Interventions):

1. The Ananya girls Federation members submitted the demand charter to MP Sj. Basant Kumar Panda and MLA Sj. Rajendra Prasad Dholkia work for youths as per skill on the world youth skill day. As a result both of the leaders assured for an opening textile industry to employ youths at Nuapada.
2. 571no. Nutritional Garden is promoted by adolescent girls with the coordination of Odisha Livelihood Mission, Nuapada in this reporting quarter.
3. 500no. of adolescent girls who are 18years & above are engaged in agriculture work and are earning 200 Rs per day. The ultimate economic opportunities are explore to keep them engaged.
4. 6nos.of adolescent boys and 2no.of girls are selected as a volunteer by the District Collector Mrs. Madhusmita Sahoo for Covid19 immediate response work at Nuapada from Dumerpani, Sahipala, Biromal, and Darlimunda cluster.
5. Miss. Deepanjali Sahu got first prize in poster competition organized by UNV and YRC at Nuapada&it was highlighted in their official website. At the same way Biromal Cluster coordinator Mr.DhabaleswarHarijan is chosen as a member (NGO representative) of Biromal PHC (N) executive committee for monitoring of adolescent health components.
6. 27no. of adolescent girls engaged in income generation activity in different trades like tailoring, GNM, Beauty parlor etc. On the other hand 450nos. of adolescent girls from Tanwat engaged in collectingKendu leaves and income 250rs.



7. 17no.of adolescent are provided Start-Up Support and 13no.of Top-Up Support to establish their own entrepreneurship. And they are oriented on the business expansion by district sub collector, DPM of OLM, nuapada and DYK, NYKS.
8. 3200no. of mask is stitched by 85no.of adolescent discussion leaders and 2079no.of mask is distributed to adolescent girl and community stakeholders free of cost, and

then 1129no.of mask is sold @ 20rs, per piece by adolescent discussion leader in our project area .and demanded to local administration to distribute mask free of cost



Outcome 1: Young people are better informed about SRHR, including adverse effects of child marriage and empowered to voice their needs and rights.

Awareness on COVID19 &ROEO:

During the pandemic situation 100no.of adolescent discussion leaders are initiated in different home based activities like: quiz competition, painting, poem writing, poster competition and slogan,as a result 2199no.of adolescent and community stakeholders engaged or reached by the discussion leaders to share on the prevention of COVID19 and discuss project components. On the other hand 3139 adolescent girls and community stakeholders outreach by PNGO staffs through Tele-digital communication and social media groups. The Cluster Coordinators and Girl federation, Adolescent girls have shared govt. approved IEC materials on the prevention of corona virus, menstrual health and hygiene, child protection and govt. issued & declaration letters.

Awareness on COVID19 Response by Girls Federation:

10no.of members each of Beer Kanya Yubati Sangha from Amanara and Maa. Sakti yubati sangha from parkod campaigned on the **Swachta Abhiyan** in their cluster in order to sanitize their panchayat from corona virus, along with community stakeholders are sensitized on the preventive measure of corona virus like: adopting hand wash practice, maintaining social distancing, using mask and support medical team when corona symptoms are seen any person in the cluster.



Campaign on "I am not sitting free at home":

371no.of adolescent engaged in campaign **"I am not sitting**

free at home” they are involved in making different handicrafts, painting, slogan writing, story writing , poem writing, poster making, short video etc on the emerging issues of Covid19, SRHR issues, child marriage, girls education, child rights. As the result 7nos. of adolescent from Khaliapani engaged in making Achar, Bodi, and Pampad as their sources of income.

On the occasion of World Youth Skill Day Ananya girl’s federation gave a demand charter to MP Mr. Basant Kumar Panda and MLA Mr. Rajendra Prasad Dholkia for open an employment opportunities at Nuapada and to provide work as per skill. The Poster competition were conducted and appreciated for best poster making as 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize. There were total 63no.of adolescent girls participated in competition.

In response to COVID19 the adolescent girls and community stakeholders are sensitized through Tele Digital communication, social media groups and shared the IEC materials. 3200no. of mask is distributed among the girls and community members free of cost and 1129no.of mask is sold @20/- per piece to prevent corona virus. Discussed major aspect of covid19 (like: avoid social gathering, do not touch of nose, mouth, eyes and face, using mask, practice using hand washing through sanitization, avoid person who snitch, cough, throat pain and suffering from breathing).



Outcome 2: Increased access to formal education for girls at risk of and affected by child marriage

School Intervention by DLs:

- 62nos. of schools and college students are continuing their online classes in our project area in this pandemic situation and our girl’s federations members are regularly following no. of children attending the classes and engage other children who are not taking interest to attend online classes. There are 3000 adolescent and children attending online classes. And supporting household works at home. On the other way 29 nos. of students participated in smart kid painting competition that was organized by save the children odisha leading newspaper Sambad.
- The startup support enhanced to Miss. RajkumariSahu for continuing the higher study that had dropped her study. The entrepreneurship provided to stand again to take re-admission in an intermediate at National collage, silda. And she has also

started saving out of her entrepreneurship.

Associated with Book distribution:

- 1553nos. of children are distributed books for new academic session 2020-21 with the support of discussion leaders and federation members at 9 clusters. And they sensitize children to prevent CORONA virus staying at home. And attending online classes. Almost 3000 school children & 62no. of adolescent are involved in online classes and trainings in different aspect.
- World against Child Labour Day was observed in 9 clusters to spread the message of prevent of child labour at garage, hotel, tea stall, domestic work in house ect. 90no. of children and adolescent involved in the program and webinar was facilitated by expert team to discuss child friendly environment at home during lockdown. No child should be punished or abuse during the shutdown due to corona virus.

Outcome 3: Increased access to economic opportunities for girls at risk of and affected by child marriage, and their families.

- 27no. of adolescent girls are engaged in different trades. The adolescents have concern about the financial support of family through the engagement in different trades and livelihood activities. During the lockdown many adolescent girl started income by making home decor items. In Tanwat cluster 450 girls are engaged in collection of kendu leaf and earning 250/- per day.



- 15no. of adolescent girls are provided start up support and 13no. of adolescent are provided top up support to expand their own business and support their family financially.
- 17no. of adolescent girls are provided start up support and they started income Rs. 1000 to Rs. 5000 per month and they support their family financially. They have become the self-reliant, self-independence for their life. The ultimate objective of project has been achieved through making girl entrepreneur at project areas. One of the adolescent girls from Biromal has opened bank account for saving purposes.

- The adolescent girls are engaged in paddy land for agriculture purposes and they earn Rs. 200 per day apart from the online classes students. The girls are not sitting at home rather engaged in livelihood/income generation activities at project areas. They have understood the importance of earning and supporting family.
- 8no.of adolescent girls received gram panchayat level fund to start their own entrepreneurship at their panchayat. Per person received 4500 from Biromal cluster.The adolescent girls of our project area promoted entrepreneurship rather than engaging in daily labour work.7no.of adolescent girls engaged in income generation activities like tailoring, kirana store, home tutor, Beauty parlour and income 2000 to 7000.

Outcome 4: Increased access to child protection systems for girls at risk of and affected by child marriage

Creating awareness by VCPC:

- The awareness was created by VCPC members in our project area on the prevention of COVID19 by informing and demonstrating on hand wash techniques, proper use of mask, how to take care of siblings, stay away from sexual abuse and domestic violence during lockdown.And theVCPC members are helping SMC members, teachers for distributed the books and cooked foods to the children in project intervention areas. There 326nos of VCPC members connected through telephonic conversation.
- 96nos. of labour card, 1 birth registration and 3 nos. of Marriage registration forms were filling up by Miss DharyaSahu the member of Tulasiyubati Sangha at Tanwat panchayat.

VCPC Conference through Zoom Meet: VCPC meeting was organized at block level through Zoom meeting application. And the key discussion point was how to engage VCPC members to response the pandemic situation. And ensure the safety and security of children during lockdown. There were 15 nos. of VCPC members participated in the meeting.



Outcome 5: Increased utilization of SRHR services that are responsive to the needs of young people, particular girls at risk of-, and affected by child marriage.

Adolescent Health Checkup: 191nos.of adolescent had health check-up through VHND in our project areas. And from them 4nos. Of girls referred to Shradha Clinic. On the other way 260 nos. of adolescent girl accessed to IDC. They could learn about the BMI, Contraceptives, Nutritional food intake, menstrual health & hygiene ect.

- 307no.of adolescent girls distributed sanitary napkin during the celebration of menstrual hygiene day was celebrated at 9 clusters. There were total 11nos. stakeholders and 225nos. of adolescent girls participated in the program.
- On the occasion of Population day with the collaboration of ASHA and AWW, ANANYA federation member have sensitized on the method of population control like:contraceptives, and family planning etc. The family method has been introduced and types of contraceptive are discussed in detail. 1000 adolescent girls have taken IFA tablet for 1 year who doesn't go to school.Deworming day observed at our project area through ANANYA girls federation members.
- National Nutrition Month was observed in our project area. There were more than 300 adolescent girls, community stakeholders participated in this program. On the occasion of National Nutritional Month 300nos of Ananya girls federation members, VCPC members, ASHA, AWW,ANM gave a step towards red zone to yellow zone, and how all adolescence get nutritional food in their day to day life. The webinar was conducted to sensitized the theme of nutritional month at district level where 68no. of participants participated.

Sharing of IEC materials on SRHR:

127no. of adolescent have shared the SRHR related IEC materials and prevention of COVID19 to the community stakeholders and adolescent group members. Preventive measures are taken at clusters level by the federation members.



Outcome 6: Increased engagement and collective social action against child marriage and in support of ASRHR

Interacted with Men's Group:

The members of Men's group were interacted and discussed on the prevention of corona virus and supporting adolescent girl for personal health hygiene. Discussed regarding the domestic violence, child abuse, child protection related issues during lockdown. There were total 47no.of group member connected for discussion through mobile interaction.

PRI members, VCPC members and girl's federation members are helping AWW for distributing the IFA tablets, dry foods etc.

Outcome 7: Supportive rights-based legal and policy environment against child marriage

Advocacy Initiatives by ADL:

- In the reporting quarter advocated for 2609no.of labour card holders to 1500 per person under NirmanShramikYojana with the support of adolescent girls and local PRIs at out project areas. As a result these persons received the amount in their account. And then the adolescent also advocated for benefiting the govt. schemes at rural areas along with distribution of 11000no.of mask in 9 panchayat by District Rural Development Agency, Nuapada.
- 2500 migrant people returned from different states of India and different districts of Odisha, out of them 10nos.of adolescent girls from Amanara, Sahipala, Budhipali, Darlimunda and Biromal cluster. In order to response the needful 8247nos.of people have received 5kg.of rice and 3kg dal per person under the ration card holder by local government at 9 clusters.

VULNERABLE COMMUNITY PROGRAMME (VCP)

SUPPORT BY ZILLA SWASTHYA SAMITI, NHM, NUAPADA

Operational Area- Soseng & Sunabeda GP

Outcome of the Project:

Maximize the health care services for more population in 2 Gram Panchayats at the door step wherein to control the diseases through regular checkups & treatment. People of the locality will get awareness on different health schemes and programmes which will ultimately create demands.



VCP Lunching Programme

The VCP Lunching Program was conducted with Support of ZSS, CHC, Komna & PHC, Sunabeda. There were 29 nos of Participants participated, Medical officer, CHC Komna, PHC Sunabeda Medical Team, SAI, MHU team And Project Stakeholders of Sunabeda & Soseng Panchayat along with ASHA, ANM, AWW and Project Staff.



SHG Meeting

During the project period 30 numbers of SHG meetings were organised in both the GPs. Total 288 numbers of SHG members were participated & learnt different aspects on maternal child and adolescent health issues and services which are as follows: Regarding child health discussed on immunization, RBSK, HBNC, NRC, JSSY, De-worming day and the complication of hazards period of child up to 3 years. In maternal health discussed on JSY, VHND, Maternity waiting home, KMC, & Infant & Young Child feeding practices. Under RSKK program adolescent health services are discussed. Apart from all, Promotion of menstrual health and hygiene, WIFS and peer education on health & nutritional food intake etc also imparted.



VHND & Immunisation

VHNDs are facilitated for health check-up of left out and drop out pregnant and lactating mother and child, adolescent at Sunabeda and Sosengpanchayat. The participant is sensitized on the importance of health check-up during of women of drop outs. There were total 373 no. of pregnant women, mothers and adolescent attended.



Gaon Kalyan Samiti (GKS)

The Gaon Kalyan Samiti meeting is conducted in 20 nos of villages of Soseng & Sunabeda GP. There was total 304 no. of GKS members participated in the meeting. The following points are discussed during the GKS meeting. During the meeting it's discussed on the importance of health services through VHND & Immunization. How pregnant and lactating mother are left out from health check-up. It's pointed out the issues of nutritional food intake during pregnancy and lactating mother. Along with home



visit of HW for counselling and follow up. The most importance and function of existing GKS in the revenue village, introductory on the work of GKS like: promotion of health and hygiene in the village by GKS, helping on the health complications and proper utilization of untied fund.

BalikaMandal Formation

BalikaMandal formation meeting was conducted in 10 villages & 10 BalikaMandal formed during the year. The adolescents were sensitized on the health services under RKSK and importance health checkups through VHND& Follow up Balika Mandal Meeting.



Anti-Natal and Post Natal care camp

The Anti-Natal and Post Natal care camps are conducted for the drop out and left pregnant women and lactating women at 2no.of Panchayat Sunabeda&Soseng GP. There were total 12 no. of women had health check-up in both panchayat.

BalikaMandal training

5no. of BalikaMandal training was conducted at 5 villages consist of 149no.of participants. The adolescent were sensitized on the health services under RKSK, Personal Hygiene, nutrition Food and importance health checkup through VHND.

Birth preparedness calendar

100 no's Birth preparedness calendar are prepared at both gram panchayat.

BalikaMandal Follow Up Meeting



11 Nos of BalikaMandal Follow up Meeting conducted. The adolescent were sensitized on the health services under RKSK and importance health check-up through VHND& Follow up.

Counselling and Health check-up camps for adolescent (AHD)

AHD was observed with 300 adolescents. It focused on menstrual hygiene, adolescent health, and nutritious, personal hygiene. Adolescents weight, height. & IFA tablet and Sanitary Napkin were distributed.

The objectives, strategies and activities of the Family Planning division are designed and operated towards achieving the family welfare goals and objectives stated in various policy documents (NPP: National Population Policy 2000, NHP: National Health Policy 2017, and NHM: National Rural Health Mission) and to honour the commitments of the Government of India (including ICPD: International Conference on Population and Development, MDG: Millennium Development Goals, SDG: Sustainable Development Goals, and others). 16 nos of Sensitization to Eligible couple on Family Planning meeting were Conducted in Sunabeda & Soseng GP. 220 couple were participated in the sensitization programme wherein family planning, & its benefits & the reason for which gap between babies required, etc taught.

As we know that health is wealth & all have to take utmost care on their own to make themselves self reliant & lead a healthy life more specifically during such Pandemic situation. ASHA, Odisha is trying to revive certain health related issues of Maternal health, Adolescent health, etc. Project aims to create a healthy lifestyle to build up a healthy immune system and to avoid disease among all.

Project: Distress Migration (MGNREGA) supported by DRDA, Nuapada**Project Objective:**

- Cover the ultra-Poor households in Migration affected Gram Panchayats.
- People become aware of the provision under MGNREGA, NRLM & Skill Development and avail the benefit.
- Facilitate INRM based Planning exercise in project villages so that the villages have plans to be under taken under MGNREGA for Creating durable asset focusing on livelihoods
- Facilitating paradigm shift in Implementation from wage employment to combination of wage and self-employment.
- Development of sustainable livelihood security plan at household level with area and Cluster approach towards sustainable livelihood.
- Creation of Household level asset base for land holders, marginal farmers and landless families along with creating community level asset base

It has been seen that Migration is the ultimate opportunity for the poor people who have faced challenge in their own backyard. However, certain consequences have changed the mindset of poor households. We can see that in Odisha more specifically western part of Odisha is more prone to migration due to lack of job opportunities. Among all, Nuapada is one of the poorest and underdeveloped districts in Odisha. The economy of the district is predominantly agriculture and the performance in this sector is crucial to the development of the district. The prevalence of small farmers having small sized landholdings, seasonal unemployment, the non-application of modern technology in agriculture in the district had forced the people to search for alternate sources of livelihood. People of the rural areas migrate to urban areas within and outside their districts and also to the neighbouring states. Migration is an outcome due to the repeated drought that strike Nuapada at regular intervals.

ASHA Odisha is a leading NGO in Nuapada district and with support from district administration has taken some measures to check the migration in some rural pocket of Nuapada. ASHA has organised series of village meeting to analyse the standard of living condition along with problems & opportunities of the community in order to create alternate livelihood options for them. ASHA Odisha, identified the marginalised list & the same has been validated by the community itself. However, ASHA Odisha has completed household survey to find out the status of each & every household & apart from that ASHA Odisha organised Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) such as Social Map, Resource Map, Wellbeing Mapping, etc only to cater the need of the community and find the best alternate action for them as well.

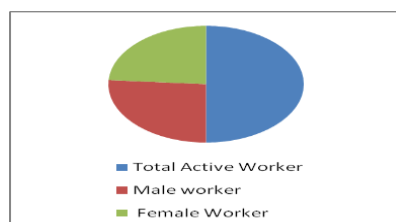

During the financial year 2020-21, 126 People have been connected to the project from 200Pn to 2 people in 300 days.



In the current financial year, 10 gram panchayats have spent more than 60% on Person days, while the remaining 4 gram panchayats have spent 55%.

Land Leveling & Bonding.

This is a method wherein sloppy lands made usable for the community. This increases soil and moisture conservation in the field. A bond is an earthen embankment made around an agriculture plot to conserve soil and moisture. Once land identified then patch planning was made for leveling and bonding, accordingly plan for the plot boundaries. The total cost of measure approximately varies from Rs. 40,000 to 70,000 wherein the labor component is 100% of the cost. Maximum 234 man-days are required for the same.

Last year ASHA Odisha tried its level best to enhance the opportunity for the poor to check distress migration. Keeping view of this, 143 hectares of land was repaired by 127 farmers from 35 villages in 10 gram panchayats. Up land to Low Land, land bonding, land equalization made to keep the land use in rainy days. Now, it has been analyzed that people will get 15 to 18 bags of paddy instead of 7 to 8 bags in earlier. However, the development of land will certainly give better result & better output to fulfill their daily needs wherein the earning from MGNREGA around Rs. 40000.00/- to Rs. 70000.00/- per worker will give them more boost for saving of extra money for their future use & stopped migration.

SUCCESS STORY OF CHANGE THROUGH INRM UNDER MGNREGA

At:- Golabandh

Land leveling (development) is one of the most challenging works in the drought prone region like Nuapada dist. Upland and uneven terrain makes agriculture a daunting task. MGNREGA creates ample opportunity for poor during this Pandemic situation wherein people have used their resources for which they are paid & at the same time they have developed their upland/barren/fallow land into a cultivable one.

Lachman Majhi is a small farmer having 1.5 acre of land and living in a small village named Golabandh of GP-Kermeli, Block-Nuapada, dist-Nuapada. He owned a small patch of a land which was less productive and faced a lot of problem to feed his family members of 7 members. He used to be a migrant labor to earn extra. During 2020-21, he applied for land leveling in the panchayat of his village which was later sanctioned & he received a worth of Rs.45000/- from MGNREGA by developing his own small patch of land into cultivable land. Now, Lachman Majhi used that developed land for paddy cultivation. He is very thankful to MGNREGA which changed his life and now his income has been enhanced by 17000.00/- per year in comparison to previous years.



30X40 Model

The 30x40 model is done on barren land or in Upland. Earlier people were used those barren/ upland for cultivation of green gram, black gram and in certain cases horse gram or they simply vacant those land. Now, those lands were developed under MGNREGA & being used for mixed farming. Under MGNREGA, 17 hectares of land developed for 19 beneficiaries of 10 villages coming under 7 GPs. wherein Rs. 80,000.00/- per hectare was being paid and now those barren/upland became a property for the poor.

Pagarpani village of Godfula gram panchayat is located 10 km from Nuapada block. The village is home to about 185 families, 70% of whom are tribal families. About 80% of the families in the village subsist on farming and day labour. Due to the high number of UP lands in the village, many people cultivate Pulses, and some of them have land. The NREGA planned to make a model of 30x40 on the land in order to make better use of the land.

The family agreed after the village's 5 hec. Vacant land, which was owned by five farmers, was put together on a 5 hect. Plot of land, explaining what the 30x40 model was and its benefits. The land was upgraded from a 30x40 model NREGA scheme to a payment of up to Rs.90,000.

The wheel Linkage farmers with the horticulture department, planting mango trees on 5 hectares of land free of charge, and opening the holes, and also hires the tree department to take care of the trees.

The land, which had been flowed all year, is now being cultivated mixed with fruit trees. Exactly 3 years later, the beneficiary suggested that the fruit tree should earn a son.

Trench cum Bund(TCB)

Most of the land (around 70%) in Nuapada Block is sloping and on rainy days, the rainwater comes & goes out resulting erosion of soil & moisture from the field & reduced the level of ground water as well. ASHA, Odisha promoted TCB work & upgraded 412.47 hectares of land which covered 159 beneficiaries of 39 villages in 10 gram panchayats. Around 320-400 MGNREGA beneficiaries were involved for the said activity & now water is available for them during rainy season in upland area.

Dug Well

Since most of the Nuapada block is hilly and forest based, around 70% of farmers grow cereals in this area during rainy season. People of this area were depended on Raipur for vegetables. ASHA Odisha promoted a dug well in Kankermenji village of Kermeli Gram Panchayat for Dhansingh Rout wherein he received Rs14800.00/- in material and labor support as well. Now, he is doing vegetables cultivation in his land & sells it in his village & nearby villages.

Introduction:-

Kankermenji Village is located around 3 km away from Kermeli GP office and 18 km away from Block head quarter Nuapada. The Story of Kankermenji Village and Dug Well is a Good example of the benefits to the individual Beneficiary from MGNREGA Programme. There are 87 nos of Job card holders in the villages. The average annual rainfall is 1378.2 mm in Nuapada dist. Kankermenji Village is known for Agriculture, the villagers are economically backward and rain-fed agriculture is the primary source of livelihood.

Dhansingh Rout is a FRA beneficiaries lives in the village. Though he has a special category job card but due to unavailability of work, it has been difficult for him to earn. He owned a land of 3.3 acres in which he used only 1 acre of land for paddy cultivation & rest of land he lefts unused due to scarcity of water wherein he earns very less amount to survive. In 2019-20, a dug well was approved for him under MGNREGA



only to use those unused land throughout the year. Now, he is involved in agricultural activity for 8 months & rest of the time he is busy in doing MGNREGA work. MGNREGA is a real blessing for him as because now he sold vegetables & received Rs.12000/- last year and also completed 100 days labor work under MGNREGA work. Now, he is earning from both agriculture & MGNREGA and able to educate his 3 children.

Farm Pond/ Multipurpose Farm Pond

A pond is a small structure (about 1000 to 1500 sq feet) with an average depth of 8 to 10 feet cut in a corner of an individual field on medium lowland and low land. It acts as a harvesting structure during the monsoons and also helps to recycle sub-surface flow locally in the post monsoon months. Lowland tanks are made in a series so that the initial monsoon rains are better harvested and the sub-surface flow can be arrested and recycled better in the post monsoon months.

Farmers 'Pond and Multipurpose Farm Pond 21 have been set up on the land of 21 beneficiaries from 14 villages to make use of both khariff crop & Rabi crop annually on small farmers' land and create permanent assets for the village. Under MGNREGA, the workers are paid between Rs16000.00/- and Rs20000.00/-.

Earthen Compost Pit:

This is needless to say that community belongs to poor having always depending upon agricultural activity as to fulfill their food requirement per year wherein project focused on Bio-produces. 1858 female beneficiaries from 58 villages of our 10 gram panchayats have been connected and assisted with Earthen compost Pit (10x10x3) under MGNREGA. The Earthen compost pit has cleared the village of cleanliness and environmental pollution.



Mo UpakariBagicha

In 22 villages in the following seven gram panchayats in Nuapada district, 612 members of the self-help group were given the opportunity to cultivate vegetables and fruit trees in various varieties of Mo UpakariBagicha through the Odisha Livelihood Mission. Beneficiaries of the scheme were connected to the NREGA scheme for remuneration. From Rs. 1,800 to Rs.5,400 beneficiaries were provided with nutritious food.

CASE STUDY

Distress Situation

Through the outreach awareness activity program by CHILDLINE team a child was found in the village Bhairbhadi .The child name is Bipin Rout. Age 7 Years, Sex Male. Who needs to be taken care & protection as his father is a mental ill person and his



mother is absent since long. Bipin's father Kailash Rout was sending his son to begging and was physically and mentally tortured or abused. Bipin was begging for the last one year.

CHILDLINE Intervention

The CHILDLINE team members reached kailash Rout's house and discussed with the community people, Anganwadi Workers and Sarpanch on care and protection of the child. After counselling Kailas Rout was unable to support Bipin Rout due to mental illness. Bipin Rout's mother name is Costi Rout was physically and mentally abused by her father and went to her mother's home at Bargarh district. As a result lack of care and protection of Bipin Rout.

CHILDLINE Impact

The CHILDLINE team and CWC counselled the boy to address the issues and started the documentation process and produced the child to the Child Welfare Committee (CWC). As the order of CWC, CHILDLINE Nuapada went to the khariar and hand over a child (Bipin Rout) to Navprabha shelter home, Khariar. Now the child health is good condition and he is very happy.
